Help Keep York County Warm!

Habitat for Humanity York County's community weatherization program, Keep York County Warm!, provides weatherization services for 40 low-income homeowners in York County each year. Through new partnerships with Efficiency Maine and local energy auditors, 40 low-income homeowners will now receive up to a \$1,050 of weatherization services and materials at no cost to the homeowner. Additionally, Keep York County Warm! provides reusable, removable interior storm window inserts.

The Summit Project is at the ReStore!

The ReStore is honored to be hosting The Summit Project this month. The Summit Project is a Maine-based nonprofit whose mission is to recognize and honor Maine Veterans who have passed away since September 11, 2001. Families of these fallen heroes have unearthed and donated a special memorial stone that uniquely represents their loved one. The Summit Project engraves the stones and volunteers have hiked up and down mountains throughout Maine and across the world carrying the tribute stones in their packs, making the Summit Project a living memorial.

A selection of the stones travels the state in a special display known as "The Honor Case." The Summit Project's Honor Case is on display at the ReStore, until it moves on to its next destination.

On November 18, a group of volunteers will hike from the Kennebunk Library to the ReStore carrying selected stones from the case to commission the new honor case location. Volunteers will have the opportunity to hear the stories of the soldiers whose stones they will be carrying, making a personal connection with them. At the library, the walkers will pause for a sharing session with one another and upon their return, share their experiences in writing with the families of the fallen soldiers.
